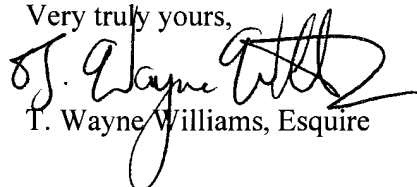

I represent A William Reid who is a current mortgage holder with GMAC Mortgage, # [REDACTED] 9878, for his house located at 153 Pinewood Road, Virginia Beach, Virginia, 23451. We are currently in discussions with representatives of the title insurance company and GMAC's representatives regarding our legal claims and a dispute over title issues, the mortgage balance and taxes. As of the current date no resolution has been accomplished. Although a global resolution is possible, my client still has outstanding claims against GMAC and any of its assigns, affiliates or subsidiaries. This correspondence is intended to put the debtors on notice that my client wishes to preserve all of his legal rights afforded him under the law. My client's causes of action include, but are not limited to: a) fraud; b) misrepresentation; c) defamation; d) breach of contract and e) interference with business opportunities.
