FOURTH MONTHLY AND FINAL FEE APPLICATION OF SAUL EWING ARNSTEIN & LEHR LLP, DELAWARE COUNSEL TO THE TO THE OFFICIAL COMMITTEE OF UNSECURED CREDITORS OF AKORN, INC., *ET AL.*, FOR PAYMENT OF COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES INCURRED FOR THE (I) MONTHLY PERIOD FROM SEPTEMBER 1, 2020 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 4, 2020 AND (II) FINAL PERIOD FROM JUNE 10, 2020 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 4, 2020

Saul Ewing Arnstein & Lehr LLP ("Saul Ewing" or "Applicant"), hereby submits this fourth monthly and final fee application (the "Application") seeking payment of compensation for services rendered and reimbursement of expenses incurred as Delaware counsel to the Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors (the "Committee") of Akorn, Inc., *et al.* (the "Debtors") under sections 330 and 331 of title 11 of the United States Code (the "Bankruptcy Code"), Rule 2016 of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure (the "Bankruptcy Rules"), Rule 2016-2 of the Local Rules of Bankruptcy Practice and Procedure of the United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of Delaware (the "Local Bankruptcy Rules"), the Order Establishing Procedures for Interim Compensation and Reimbursement of Expenses for Professionals [D.I. 218] (the "Interim Compensation Order"); and the Order Confirming the

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Modified Joint Chapter 11 Plan of Akorn, Inc. and Its Debtor Affiliates [D.I. 673] (the "Confirmation Order").

By this Application, Saul Ewing seeks: (i) a monthly allowance of compensation in the amount of \$13,077 for the period from September 1, 2020 through September 4, 2020 (the "**Monthly Compensation Period**") and (ii) final allowance of compensation in the amount of \$91,678.50, together with reimbursement of expenses in the amount of \$28,558.65, for a total of \$120,237.15 for the period June 10, 2020 through September 4, 2020 (the "**Final Compensation Period**"). In support of the Application, Saul Ewing respectfully represents as follows:

Jurisdiction

The Court has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 157 and 1334.
 This matter is a core proceeding within the meaning of 28 U.S.C. § 157(b)(2). Venue is proper pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1408 and 1409.

2. The statutory bases for the relief requested herein are sections 330 and 331 of the Bankruptcy Code.

Background

3. On May 20, 2020 (the "**Petition Date**"), each of the Debtors filed a voluntary petition for relief under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code (the "**Chapter 11 Cases**"). The Debtors are operating their businesses and managing their properties as debtors in possession pursuant to sections 1107(a) and 1108 of the Bankruptcy Code. No request for the appointment of a trustee or examiner has been made in these Chapter 11 Cases.

4. On June 3, 2020, the Office of the United States Trustee (the "UST") appointed the Committee pursuant to section 1102(a)(1) of the Bankruptcy Code [D.I. 125], which

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comprised of the following members: McKesson Corporation, Douglas Pharmaceuticals America Ltd., Walgreen Co., Rising Pharma Holdings, Inc. and Gabelli Funds, LLC.

5. On June 23, 2020, the Court entered the Interim Compensation Order, which sets forth the procedures for interim compensation and reimbursement of expenses for all professionals in the Chapter 11 Cases.

6. The Interim Compensation Order provides, among other things, that a Professional may submit monthly fee applications. If no objections are made within twenty (20) days after service of the monthly fee application, the Debtors are authorized to pay the Professional eighty percent (80%) of the requested fees and one hundred percent (100%) of the requested expenses. All fees and expenses paid are on an interim basis until final allowance by the Court.

7. The Interim Compensation Order also states that attorneys must make a reasonable effort to comply with the requirements of the United States Trustee's *Guidelines for Reviewing Applications for Compensation. and Reimbursement of Expenses Filed under 11* U.S.C. §330 by Attorneys in Larger Chapter 11 Cases Effective as of November 1, 2013 (the

"Revised UST Guidelines").

8. On July 20, 2020, this Court entered the Order Authorizing the Employment and Retention of Saul Ewing Arnstein & Lehr LLP as Delaware Counsel to the Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors, Effective as of June 10, 2020 [D.I. 359].

9. On September 4, 2020, the Court entered the Confirmation Order confirming the Debtors' modified joint plan (the "**Plan**"). The effective date of the Plan occurred on October 1, 2020 [D.I. 750].

Saul Ewing's Fee Statements

10. The fee statements for the Final Compensation Period were attached to the previously filed monthly fee applications [D.I. 378, 647 and 736] (collectively, the "**Monthly Fee Applications**"). The Monthly Fee Applications contain the daily time logs describing the time spent by each attorney and paraprofessional for these periods. The fee statements for the Monthly Compensation Period are attached hereto as **Exhibit A**. Also attached as **Exhibit A** is a summary of compensation requested by project category during the Final Compensation Period.

Summary of Services Rendered

11. A summary of the work that Saul Ewing performed for the Final Compensation Period is set forth below.

- (a) <u>Asset Sale Disposition</u>. This category includes all time spent in connection with matters related to the disposition of property of the estate, including issues arising from the sale of substantially all of the Debtors' assets. Time in this category includes reviewing various sale documents, objections to the sale and various sale related orders; and communicating with Jenner & Block LLP ("Jenner") and Huron Consulting Services LLC ("Huron") regarding the sale process and related issues, and the closing.
- (b) <u>**Case Administration**</u>. This category includes all time spent in connection with matters related to work regarding administration of the case. Time in this category includes reviewing the case docket and first day pleadings; drafting, revising and filing *pro hac vice* motions and an entry of appearance; and communicating with Jenner regarding the second day motions, hearing outcome, and case status.
- (c) <u>Claim Analysis, Objections, Proofs of Claim and Bar Date</u>. This category includes all time spent in connection with claim and bar date issues. Time in this category includes reviewing an administrative expense motion, a report on opt-out plaintiffs' class action claims, a motion to reclassify claims (the "**Reclassify Motion**") and a joinder to same, objections to the Reclassify Motion and a reply in support of same; reviewing, revising and filing a response to the Reclassify Motion; and communicating with Jenner regarding the Reclassify Motion and a response to same.
- (d) <u>Committee Matters</u>. This category includes all time spent in connection with issues involving the Committee. Time in this category includes

preparing for and participating in Committee calls; reviewing Committee updates; reviewing a nondisclosure agreement, communications with the Committee regarding status of negotiations regarding a nondisclosure agreement, various motions and objections; communicating with the UST regarding a request for an equity committee and a request to expand the Committee; and communicating with Jenner regarding a request for an equity committee issues.

- (e) <u>**Creditor Inquiries**</u>. This category includes all matters related to communicating with creditors regarding contract assumption issues.
- (f) <u>Employee Benefits and Pensions</u>. This category includes all time spent in connection with various employee issues. Time in this category includes reviewing communication with the Debtors regarding the bonus program.
- (g) <u>Executory Contracts and Unexpired Leases</u>. This category includes all time spent in connection with contract and lease analysis, the assumption, assignment or rejection of executory contracts and unexpired leases, and cure claims. Time in this category includes reviewing a notice of termination of contract; and communicating with Jenner regarding the notice of termination of contract.
- (h) <u>Fee/Employment Applications (Saul Ewing)</u>. This category includes all matters related to the review and preparation of a retention application and fee applications for Saul Ewing. Time in this category includes drafting, revising and filing Saul Ewing's retention application and monthly fee applications and certifications of no objection regarding same.
- (i) <u>Fee/Employment Applications (Other Professionals)</u>. This category includes all matters related to the review and analysis and filing of retention and fee applications for other professionals in these Chapter 11 Cases. Time in this category includes revising and filing Jenner and Huron's retention applications and a motion to shorten notice of the retention applications; drafting, revising and filing certifications of no objection regarding Jenner and Huron's retention applications; and communicating with Jenner regarding the Committee's professionals' retention and fee applications and the investment banker fee structure.
- (j) <u>Financing and Cash Collateral</u>. This category includes all matters relating to debtor in possession financing and cash collateral issues. Time in this category includes reviewing the DIP motion and budget; reviewing and revising an objection to the DIP motion; and communicating with Jenner regarding financing issues.
- (k) <u>Litigation: Contested Matters and Adversary Proceedings</u>. This category includes all matters relating to litigation. Time in this category includes reviewing discovery request; uploading discovery production;

drafting and revising a motion for standing; drafting, revising and filing a certification, order and stipulation to extend the challenge deadline; communicating with the Lenders regarding the challenge deadline; reviewing a draft demand letter regarding D&O issues, a 9019 motion and an objection to same, notices of appeal, and a motion for stay pending appeal; and communicating with Jenner regarding challenge deadline, discovery request production, motion for standing, a 9019 motion and appeals.

- (1) <u>Plan and Disclosure Statement</u>. This category includes time related to plan and disclosure statement issues. Time in this category includes reviewing a motion to extend the exclusivity period, the disclosure statement, plan, plan procedures motion, RSA, objections filed to the plan and replies in support of the plan; conducting research regarding prior plan opinions; reviewing and revising an objection to the disclosure statement; reviewing, revising and filing a statement in support of the plan; and communicating with Jenner regarding disclosure statement and plan issues and negotiations with the Debtors.
- (m) Preparation for and Attendance at Hearing. This category includes time related to the preparation for and attendance at various court hearings. Time in this category includes preparing for and attending hearings; reviewing hearing agendas, exhibits and witnesses list; and communicating with Jenner regarding hearing issues.
- (n) <u>**Relief from Stay and Adequate Protection**</u>. This category includes time related to the preparation for and attendance at various court hearings. Time in this category includes reviewing MDL's stay relief motion

12. A summary of the actual and necessary expenses and daily logs of expenses

incurred by Saul Ewing during the Final Compensation Period were attached to the Monthly Fee Applications. The breakdown of costs includes the rate for copying charges (\$.10/page) and the basis for each rate, facsimile charges (\$1.00/page – outgoing transmission only), telephone charges, postage, overnight delivery, travel expenses, meals, messenger service, outside photocopying, teleconferencing and legal research, all of which Saul Ewing normally bills to its non-bankruptcy clients at rates calculated to compensate Saul Ewing for only the actual cost of the expense.

Compliance with Bankruptcy Code, Local Rules, Interim Compensation Order, Confirmation Order and Revised UST Guidelines

13. To the best of Saul Ewing's knowledge, this Application complies with sections 330 and 331 of the Bankruptcy Code, Rule 2016-2 of the Local Bankruptcy Rules, the Interim Compensation Order, and the Confirmation Order, and complies with the Revised UST Guidelines.

14. In accordance with the factors enumerated in section 330 of the Bankruptcy Code, Saul Ewing submits that the services provided to the Committee by Saul Ewing during these Chapter 11 Cases were necessary and appropriate given (a) the complexity of these Chapter 11 Cases; (b) the time expended; (c) the issues involved; (d) the nature and extent of services provided, (e) the value of the such services; and (e) the cost of comparable services outside of bankruptcy.

15. Attached hereto as **Exhibit B** is Applicant's customary and comparable compensation disclosures.

16. Attached hereto as **Exhibit C** is a summary of compensation for each professional of the Applicant that worked on the Chapter 11 Cases during the Final Compensation Period.

17. Attached hereto as **Exhibit D** is a summary of expenses for the Final Compensation Period.

18. Attached hereto as **Exhibit E** is a certification of Applicant with respect to the Application.

ADDITIONAL DISCLOSURES AND REPRESENTATIONS

19. During the Final Compensation Period, Saul Ewing did not agree to any variations from, or alternatives to, its standard or customary billing rates, fees or terms for services pertaining to this engagement.

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20. None of the professionals included in this Application varied their hourly rate based on the geographical location of the bankruptcy case.

21. This Application does not include time or fees related to reviewing or revising time records or preparing, reviewing or revising invoices.

22. This Application does not include time or fees for reviewing time records to redact any privileged or other confidential information.

23. In accordance with section 504 of the Bankruptcy Code and Fed. R. Bankr. P. 2016(a), no agreement or understanding exists between Saul Ewing and any other person for the sharing of compensation received or to be received for services rendered in or in connection with this case.

24. No agreement or understanding prohibited by 18 U.S.C. § 155 has been or will be made by Saul Ewing.

25. Notice of this Application has been provided in accordance with the Interim Compensation Order. Saul Ewing submits that no other or further notice need be provided.

WHEREFORE, Saul Ewing respectfully requests that the Court enter an Order providing: (i) that, for the period of June 10, 2020 through September 4, 2020, a final allowance be made to Saul Ewing in the amount of \$91,678.50 as compensation for reasonable and necessary professional services rendered to the Committee, and in the amount of \$28,558.65 for reimbursement of actual and necessary costs and expenses incurred, for a total of \$120,237.15; (ii) that the Debtors are authorized and directed to pay to Saul Ewing the outstanding amount of all such sums; and (iii) such other and further relief as the Court deems just and proper.
