**ORDER AUTHORIZING DEBTOR TO CONTINUE ITS PARTICIPATION IN THE  
MULTIPLE EMPLOYER PARTIALLY-INSURED HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM**

Upon the Motion (the "Motion")<sup>1</sup> of Archdiocese of Milwaukee, as debtor and debtor-in-possession (the "Debtor"), seeking entry of an order granting the authority to continue its participation in the multiple employer partially-insured health insurance program covering Debtor's employees and their dependents (the "St. Raphael Health Plan"), and to pay any monthly premiums and costs incident to plan participation, and it appearing that this court has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§157 and 1334; and it appearing that this
