**DEBTORS’ REQUEST FOR EMERGENCY
CONSIDERATION OF CERTAIN “FIRST DAY” MATTERS**

Azure Midstream Partners, LP, its subsidiaries, and certain affiliates in the above-captioned chapter 11 cases, as debtors and debtors in possession (collectively, the “**Debtors**”), respectfully represent as follows in support of this request (this “**Request**”):

On January 30, 2017, the Debtors filed voluntary petitions for relief under chapter 11 of title 11 of the United States Code (the “**Bankruptcy Code**”). Counsel for the Debtors believes that these cases qualify as “Complex Chapter 11 Cases.” The Debtors need emergency consideration of the following initial case matters:

1. Emergency Motion of Debtors for an Order Directing Joint Administration of Chapter 11 Cases [Docket No. 3]
2. Notice of Designation as Complex Chapter 11 Bankruptcy Cases [Docket No. 4]
3. Emergency Motion of Debtors for Interim and Final Orders (I) Authorizing Use of Cash Collateral; (II) Granting Adequate Protection to the Prepetition Secured Lenders; and (III) Scheduling Final Hearing [Docket No. 5]
