23	BY THE COURT,	
24	The Court having reviewed and considered the joint motion and stipulation by	
25	appellant, and Defendant below, California Department of Health Care Services	
26	("Appellant") and Appellee, and Plaintiff below, Borrego Community Health	
27	Foundation, and good cause appearing, the Court hereby orders as follows:	
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Pursuant to Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure, Rule 8008(c), this
 Court hereby grants a limited remand of jurisdiction back to the Bankruptcy Court
 to allow the Bankruptcy Court to rule on the parties' contemplated joint motion to
 vacate the orders that are the subject of the present appeal, Docket Nos. 65 and 66
 entered in the adversarial proceedings below.

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a) Within 21 days of the Bankruptcy Court entering an order granting a joint motion to vacate and vacating its orders (Adv. Dkt. Nos. 65 and 66), the parties must file a joint motion to dismiss this appeal.

b) However, in the event the Bankruptcy Court denies a joint motion to
vacate its aforementioned orders (Adv. Dkt. Nos. 65 and 66), then Appellant must
file a request with this Court to restore its appellate jurisdiction within 21 days of
entry of the Bankruptcy Court's order denying the joint motion.

13 2. The Appeal and the briefing schedule shall remain stayed until further
14 order of the Court, except that the parties may file a joint motion to dismiss the
15 Appeal.

16 3. Nothing in this Order shall prejudice the Parties from seeking further17 extensions of time from this Court.
