SECOND FEE APPLICATION FOR INTERIM ALLOWANCE OF COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES FOR THE PERIOD NOVEMBER 29, 2018 THROUGH AND INCLUDING FEBRUARY 28, 2020, FILED BY CHARLES S. HEFLIN AS CONSULTING AND TESTIFYING EXPERT FOR THE ESTATE

Charles S. Heflin submits this Second Fee Application for Interim Allowance of Compensation and Reimbursement of Expenses for the Period November 29, 2018 through and including February 28, 2020 (the "Application") pursuant to 11 U.S.C. §§ 330 and 331. In support of this Application, Mr. Heflin states as follows:

INTRODUCTION

- 1. On February 8, 2010, creditor-investors filed a petition for involuntary bankruptcy against Fair Finance Company (the "**Debtor**").
- 2. On March 2, 2010, the Court entered an order granting the relief sought by the petitioning creditor-investors *nunc pro tunc* as of February 24, 2010, and appointing Brian A. Bash (the "**Trustee**") as the duly appointed trustee of the Debtor.
- 3. As part of his duty to administer and liquidate the estate for the benefit of creditors, the Trustee has needed to engage in litigation to recover assets. During the Application period, the Trustee's primary litigation included, but was not limited to, the action captioned *Bash v. Textron Financial Corp.*, *et al.*, Case No. 12-cv-00987, in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Ohio, Eastern Division (Honorable Patricia A. Gaughan) (the "**Textron Litigation**").
- 4. On June 12, 2017, the Trustee filed an application requesting court approval for the retention of Mr. Heflin as a consulting and testifying expert in connection with the Textron Litigation

[Dkt. No. 2330]. On June 29, 2017, this Court entered an order granting the Trustee's retention application in its entirety and authorizing the Trustee's retention of Mr. Heflin (the "**Retention** Order") [Dkt. No. 2343].

5. On March 23, 2017, the Trustee filed a motion requesting court approval of the Trustee's interim, monthly payment of 80% of the fees and 100% of the out-of-pocket costs incurred by the Trustee's experts retained in the Textron Litigation, including Mr. Helfin [Dkt. No. 2291]. This Court entered an order granting the Trustee's motion regarding interim compensation of these experts, including Mr. Heflin, on April 14, 2014 (the "Expert Compensation Order") [Dkt. No. 2298].

SUMMARY OF COMPENSATION AND EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT REQUESTED

6. Mr. Heflin files this Application seeking allowance for payment of services performed during the period from November 29, 2018 through and including February 28, 2020 (the "Application Period"). The Application is subject to, *inter alia*, the Retention Order and the Expert Compensation Order. Mr. Heflin has not received a retainer in connection with his engagement as an expert for the Trustee. He has received interim compensation pursuant to the Expert Compensation Order. A summary of the compensation and expense reimbursement during the Application Period is as follows:

7. Mr. Heflin has received no promise of payment for professional services rendered in this case other than in accordance with the provisions of the Bankruptcy Code.

¹ Mr. Heflin inadvertently received an overpayment of \$1,486.95 of expenses directly from Baker & Hostetler.

- 8. Mr. Heflin kept daily time records detailing the services he performed and the time expended in connection with those services by project, as directed by the Guidelines for Compensation and Expense Reimbursement of Professionals, updated May 16, 2011 (the "Guidelines").
- 9. Mr. Heflin's hourly billing rate and the number of hours billed for services rendered during the Application Period is set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u>. Set forth in <u>Exhibit B</u> is a chronological listing of services provided for the Application Period.
- 10. To the best of Mr. Heflin's knowledge, he has complied with the monthly reporting requirements.

SUMMARY OF SERVICES RENDERED

- 11. A narrative summary of the project under which material and substantial services were performed by Mr. Heflin during the Application Period is set forth below. A more detailed description of the services provided by Mr. Heflin appears in Exhibit B. During the Application Period, Mr. Heflin focused his efforts on providing consulting and testifying expert services to the Trustee in connection with the Textron Litigation.
- 12. The Trustee retained Mr. Heflin, pursuant to the Retention Order, to be used as a consulting and testifying expert in connection with the Textron Litigation. Nearly all of the services provided by Mr. Heflin during the Application Period relate to Mr. Heflin's preparation for and testimony during the Textron Litigation trial, which has now concluded.

ALLOWANCE OF COMPENSATION

13. The allowance of interim compensation for services rendered and reimbursement of expenses in bankruptcy cases is expressly provided for in Section 331 of the Bankruptcy Code:

Any professional person...may apply to the court not more than once every 120 days after an order for relief in a case under this title, or more often if the court permits, for such compensation for services rendered...as is provided under section 330 of this title.

11 U.S.C. § 331. Moreover, this Court authorized the filing of this Application in the Retention Order.

14. With respect to the level of compensation, Section 330(a)(1) of the Bankruptcy Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Court may award to a professional person "reasonable compensation for actual, necessary services rendered...." Section 330(a)(3)(A), in turn, provides:

In determining the amount of reasonable compensation to be awarded, the court shall consider the nature, the extent, and the value of such services, taking into account all relevant factors, including –

- (A) the time spent on such services;
- (B) the rates charged for such services;
- (C) whether the services were necessary to the administration of, or beneficial at the time at which the service was rendered toward the completion of, a case under this title;
- (D) whether the services were performed within a reasonable amount of time commensurate with the complexity, importance, and nature of the problem, issue, or task addressed; and
- (E) whether the compensation is reasonable based on the customary compensation charged by comparably skilled practitioners in cases other than cases under this title.
- 11 U.S.C. § 330(a)(3)(A). The clear Congressional intent and policy expressed in this statute is to provide for adequate compensation in order to continue to attract qualified and competent bankruptcy practitioners to bankruptcy cases.
- 15. The Textron Litigation involved millions of pages of documents and thousands of pages of deposition transcripts and exhibits. The Textron Litigation jury trial took place over two (2) weeks, from February 24, 2020 through March 10, 2020. As shown by this Application and the supporting documents, Mr. Heflin spent his time expeditiously preparing for his testimony in the Textron Litigation trial, and providing his expert testimony at the trial itself. Mr. Heflin engaged in appropriate efforts that were necessary to fulfill his duties as a consulting and testifying expert for the Trustee in the Textron Litigation.

REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES

16. Mr. Heflin incurred actual and necessary out-of-pocket expenses in connection with rendering professional services to the estate in the sums indicated in Exhibit C. Most of these expenses are travel and hotel costs associated with Mr. Heflin's attendance in Cleveland to meet with the Trustee's counsel and prepare for his testimony at trial in the Textron Litigation.

CONCLUSION

- 17. No agreement or understanding exists between Mr. Heflin and any other person for the sharing of any compensation to be received for professional services rendered or to be rendered in connection with this case.
- 18. Except as set forth in this Application, no prior application has been made in this or in any other court for the relief requested in the Application for the Application Period.

WHEREFORE, Mr. Heflin respectfully requests that this Court enter an order:

- a) approving the allowance for compensation of professional services rendered to the estate from November 29, 2018 through and including February 28, 2020, in the total sum of \$14,670.00;
- b) approving the reimbursement of Mr. Heflin's out-of-pocket expenses incurred in connection with the rendering of such professional services from November 29, 2018 through and including February 28, 2020, in the total sum of \$195.11;
- c) authorizing and directing the estate to pay Mr. Heflin the remaining amount due of \$1,447.05, which amount represents the amount owed for professional services rendered by Mr. Heflin during the period of November 29, 2018 through and including February 28, 2020 (\$14,865.11), *less* amounts that have been paid by the estate as of the date of this Application (\$11,931.11, as described on page 2), *less* \$1,486.95 of expenses that were inadvertently overpaid (as described in footnote 1); and
- d) granting such other and further relief as this Court may deem just and proper.


