MOTION OF THE GENERAL UNSECURED CLAIMS LITIGATION TRUSTEE FOR ENTRY OF AN ORDER FURTHER EXTENDING THE DEADLINE TO OBJECT TO THE ALLOWANCE OF CLAIMS

The General Unsecured Claims Litigation Trustee in the above referenced case, (the "GUC Trustee"), files this motion (this "Motion") for entry of an order, substantially in the form attached hereto as **Exhibit 1**, further extending the deadline to object to the allowance of any claim against the Debtor. In support of this Motion, the GUC Trustee respectfully states as follows.

Jurisdiction and Venue

1. This Court has jurisdiction pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1334, as well as pursuant to Article VIII of the Second Amended Plan of Reorganization of Groeb Farms, Inc. Pursuant to Chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code, dated November 8, 2013 [Docket No. 213] (the "Plan"). This matter is a core proceeding within the meaning of 28 U.S.C. § 157(b)(2), and the Court may enter a final order consistent with Article III of the United States Constitution.

Capitalized terms used and not otherwise defined herein shall have the meanings set forth in the Plan.

- 2. Venue in this District is proper pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1408 and 1409(a).
- 3. The statutory bases for the relief requested in this Motion are sections 105 and 502 of title 11 of the United States Code (the "Bankruptcy Code"), rules 3007 and 9006 of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure (the "Bankruptcy Rules"), and rule 9006-1(b) of the Local Rules of the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Eastern District of Michigan (the "Local Rules").

Relief Requested

- 4. By this Motion, the GUC Trustee requests entry of an order further extending the deadline (the "Claims Objection Deadline") by which the GUC Trustee may file objections to the allowance of claims (the "Claims")² by an additional six months through and including December 31, 2015. This is the GUC Trustee's third request for an extension of the Claims Objection Deadline.
- 5. The GUC Trustee notes that it has filed this Motion prior to the expiration of the current deadline to object to claims prescribed by Article VIII.E. of the Plan. *See* Plan, Art. VIII.E ("Any objections to Claims shall be Filed on or before the Claims Objection Deadline."), and Art. I.A.18. ("Claims Objection Deadline" means the deadline for objecting to a Claim, which shall be on the date that is the later of: (a) 180 days after the Effective Date . . .").

As used herein, the term "Claim" is defined as broadly as possible to also include, without limitation, the meaning of the term "Claim," as such term is defined in Article I.A.(20) of the Plan, which incorporates the meaning of the term "claim" as defined in section 101(15) of the Bankruptcy Code.

Background

- 6. On October 1, 2013 (the "Petition Date"), the Debtor filed a voluntary petition in this Court for relief under chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code.
- 7. On December 20, 2013, the Court entered an order [Docket No. 375] (the "Confirmation Order") confirming the Plan. On December 31, 2013, the Debtors filed a *Notice* of Effective Date of Debtor's Second Amended Plan of Reorganization of Groeb Farms, Inc.

 [Docket No. 380] (the "Effective Date Notice"). The Effective Date of the Plan was December 31, 2013.
- 8. In accordance with the terms of the Plan, the General Unsecured Claims
 Litigation Trust was created for the purpose, among other things, of pursuing or liquidating the
 General Unsecured Claims Litigation Trust Assets, distributing the General Unsecured Claims
 Litigation Trust Distributable Proceeds if any, reconciling and objecting to General Unsecured
 Claims as provided for in the Plan. The GUC Trustee has the power to act on behalf of the GUC
 Trust.
- 9. To date, the GUC Trust has analyzed and begun prosecuting chapter 5 avoidance causes of action, which is currently in progress. The GUC Trust has also identified and filed objections or motions regarding several categories of claims that were paid, satisfied or discharged under the Plan including those filed by holders of (i) convenience claims; (ii) equity interests; and (iii) subordinated noteholders, as well as filing objections to duplicate, amended, and superseded claims. While the GUC Trust has made progress as far as reconciling claims, there are still significant unsecured claims asserted by former directors and officers and honey

producers that will be resolved upon resolution of the litigation described in *The General* Unsecured Claims Litigation Trustee's Motion for an Order to Approve (1) Stipulation and Settlement Agreement by, Between, and Among the General Unsecured Claims Litigation Trustee, Proposed Class Representatives, Producer/Packer Claimants and the Groeb Parties, (2) Class Action Settlement Agreement and Release, and (3) Settlement and Release Agreement Between Federal Insurance Company, Groeb Farms, Inc., Natural American Foods, Inc., General Unsecured Claims Litigation Trustee, Troy L. Groeb, Robert Feerick, Thomas Jenkins and Michael Bailey, Pursuant to Sections 363(b) And 105(a) of the Bankruptcy Code and Bankruptcy Rule 9019(a) [Docket No. 511], which was recently approved by this Court on April 13, 2015 [Docket No. 518]. Specifically, the settlement described therein will need approval by the District Court, which has not yet occurred, in order for the claim releases in favor of the GUC Trust set forth therein to become effective. In addition, with respect to trade claimants who entered into new trade agreements, the Reorganized Debtor is paying a portion of their prepetition claims over a period of 18 months pursuant to the Plan, which will result in significant additional unsecured claim reductions. After the relevant time lapses, the GUC Trust will file the appropriate motion or objection before this Court to reduce the asserted trade claims by the amounts paid post confirmation.

10. Accordingly, because there are significant unsecured claims that will be reduced in the future, the GUC Trust respectfully submits that it is appropriate for the claims objection deadline to be extended for an additional six months through and including December 31, 2015.

Basis For Relief

A. <u>Cause Exists to Extend the Claims Objection Deadline.</u>

- 11. Bankruptcy Rule 9006(b) provides that the court may extend unexpired time periods "for cause shown." Fed. R. Bankr. P. 9006(b)(1). In addition, section 105(a) of the Bankruptcy Code provides that "[a] court may issue any order that is necessary or appropriate to carry out the provisions of [the Bankruptcy Code]." 11 U.S.C. § 105(a). Accordingly, this Court is authorized to extend the Claims Objection Deadline for cause.
- 12. An extension of the Claims Objection Deadline is necessary to allow the GUC Trustee sufficient time to finalize ongoing negotiations, or, if those negotiations ultimately prove unsuccessful, to file timely objections to such Claims, as appropriate. Accordingly, the GUC Trustee respectfully requests that the Court extend the Claims Objection Deadline by an additional 180 days to complete the GUC Trustee' review, analysis, and negotiations.
- 13. The extension of the Claims Objection Deadline is not sought for purposes of delay and should not prejudice claimants. Granting the extension will permit the GUC Trustee to continue to resolve Claims consensually and efficiently because the GUC Trustee may resolve disputes regarding Claims without further order of the Court pursuant to Section VIII.B. of the Plan.
- 14. Given the number of Claims filed and the extensive reconciliation process and the pending effective date of the Settlement Agreement, the GUC Trustee respectfully submits that the requested extension of the Claims Objection Deadline is just and appropriate

under the circumstances and that "cause" exists under Bankruptcy Rule 9006(a) to grant the relief requested herein.

15. Relief similar to that requested herein has been granted in recent cases in this district.³ *See*, *e.g.*, *In re Gainey* Corporation, Case No. 08-09092 (Bankr. W.D. Mich. 2013); and *In re Midcom Communications*, *Inc.*, Case No. 97-59044 (Bankr. E.D. Mich. 1999).

Notice

16. The GUC Trustee has provided notice of this Motion to: (a) the Office of the U.S. Trustee for the Eastern District of Michigan; (b) counsel to the Debtor; (c) and any party that has requested notice pursuant to Bankruptcy Rule 2002. In light of the nature of the relief requested herein, the GUC Trustee respectfully submits that no further notice is necessary.

No Prior Request

17. No prior motion for the relief requested herein has been made to this or any other court.

WHEREFORE, the GUC Trustee respectfully requests that the Court enter an order, substantially in the form attached hereto as **Exhibit 1**, granting the relief requested herein and such other and further relief as the Court deems appropriate.

Because of the voluminous nature of the orders cited herein, they are not attached to this Motion. Copies of these orders are available on request of the GUC Trustee's counsel.
