## PROCEEDINGS

THE COURT: Good afternoon, everybody. Are the parties ready to proceed?

MR. DURRER: Yes, Your Honor. This is Van Durrer, Skadden, Arps, Slate, Meagher \& Flom, on behalf of the debtors. Good afternoon. And thanks again for your time and accommodation.

Your Honor, a couple days ago at docket 418, we filed a motion to approve bidding procedures. That motion is supported by declarations by Jonathan Knee of Evercore, at docket 421, and Sean Harding of FTI Consulting, our CRO, at docket 422.

The bidding procedures are consistent with what we described for the Court on Monday afternoon and, as I understand it, are consensual. Let me clarify. I think that the committee continues to have reservations about conducting a sale process in the midst of the pandemic. But I think they agree that, as a contingency planning measure with the procedures that we've agreed to, that they don't have an objection to a proceeding. I think they're reserving rights on the outcome of the process, as I think we all are. But for now, I think that's the understanding.

And subject to the understanding, we would ask Your Honor to consider dockets 421 and 422 in evidence for purposes of approval of the bidding procedures, only.

THE COURT: Any objections? All right, then.
(Declarations by Jonathan Knee of Evercore and Sean
Harding of FTI Consulting in support of bidding procedures were hereby received into evidence as Debtors' Exhibits, as of this date.)

MR. HANSEN: No, Your Honor. This is Kris -- yeah, I was going to say, Your Honor, it's Kris Hansen with Stroock \& Stroock \& Lavan, on behalf of the official creditors' committee. Mr. Durrer's explained our position correctly. We support entry of these procedures, even though we recognize this is, in our view, not the ideal time to sell the asset. But certainly, we worked together, and we reported that to you the other day, to try to come up with a set of procedures that we all had input on and that we could put before you on a consensual basis, which is what this is.

THE COURT: Okay. Are there any parties who object to the proposed procedures?

MR. ROSENBERG: Your Honor, it's Andrew Rosenberg, Paul, Weiss, Rifkind, Wharton \& Garrison for Chatham. We have no objection.

THE COURT: Okay.

MR. MANNAL: Your Honor, Doug Mannal, from the law firm Kramer, Levin on behalf of Brigade. And we have no objection to the entry of these orders.

THE COURT: Great. Okay, I want to commend the
parties for working together to do this on short notice. I think it's -- the clarity is in everybody's interest, and I appreciate that you took me up on my suggestion last week that you do this.

I have four questions or minor comments. On the initial bid deadline, I see that you've proposed May 12th. But it's not clear to me, and I think in different parts of the procedures it's stated differently, as to whether that is a cutoff so that anybody who doesn't express interest by that deadline is left out of the process. At one point, that's what the procedures do say. I don't really understand why we have such an early cutoff, if the final bid deadline is July 1.

And I'm also concerned that some people may not even get notice, either the notices that you mail or whatever you publish, by May 12th. So is that intended to be a hard and fast deadline, or not?

MR. DURRER: Your Honor, in the declaration of Jonathan Knee, I think you'll see language that we went back to the entire group of parties under NDA. And remember, there's twenty-odd number of them. We asked them whether they needed more time than May 5th, two days ago. And the response that we got was no. So our view is that everybody's ready to go.

As I said at the hearing a few days ago, of course we're going to take a real-time assessment in consultation with the cutoff -- or with the consultation parties regarding
interest that pops up after that. But we do want to make sure that we're sharing information, the more detailed information that's become available as of May 15, the parties that actually have expressed an interest.

So I think Your Honor is basically correct that it's not $a$ hard and fast cutoff if someone is willing to show real interest. But I think they would certainly be behind their peers. And when we visited with the committee on the identity of the folks that we went out to in the first instance, they didn't have any broader group of people to talk to. So I think that the risk of people not getting notice of this is pretty small.

We issued a press release regarding the process on April 16, so that would've been out there for approximately a month. It's a public company. So we think the risk that you're identifying, Your Honor, is low. But we'll react to it in real-time and make sure that, if somebody raises their hand post-May 12 and has money and is funded and shows its interest, that we'll be happy to accommodate them.

THE COURT: Okay. Can you clarify the order and the procedures to make that clear because -- I'm sorry I didn't mark exactly where it was, but at some point as $I$ was reading it, I got -- I saw things that were inconsistent, and in one place it was stated as a hard and fast deadline, that nobody would be able to participate if they hadn't submitted by the
bid deadline.
MR. DURRER: Yeah, we'll make that clarification, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Okay, I appreciate it.
And on the stalking horse, what I've done in other cases is say that if the consultation parties are unanimous in the agreement of the stalking horse and the bid protections, then that's fine. You can do it without coming back to me.

If there's a disagreement, you really should come back to me, but I will allow you to do that on shortened notice so that if you want to -- if you have a disagreement, but you want to designate a stalking horse, you can do it on three days' notice, rather than just delegating it outright, okay?

MR. DURRER: Okay. That's no problem, Your Honor.
THE COURT: All right. On cure procedures, there's always a tension between how much time the debtors want to figure out what cure amounts are and how much time creditors need to react. Here, you've proposed to designate cure amounts as late as July 15th with an objection period of ten days. But that would actually take you later than your proposed hearing date. Do you need until July 15th to designate cure amounts?

MR. DURRER: There's going to be a schedule in the data room, as of May 15, with cure amounts, so I think that we can probably put that notice out much earlier, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Yeah, it might make a lot more sense, and
then give creditors a little more room under the current circumstances to make their responses and to give you time to talk to them, too, rather than wait until July.

MR. DURRER: Okay.
THE COURT: And I have only one other request. You asked for July 23 as a hearing date?

MR. DURRER: Yes, Your Honor.

THE COURT: That's my birthday. I'd rather do it July 24th, 27th

MR. DURRER: July 24 is fine and happy birthday, early.

THE COURT: Okay. No offense; I just didn't feel like spending it at a hearing.

MR. DURRER: We don't blame you. We just hope you'll be over the hangover by the $24 t h$.

THE COURT: I'm sure $I$ will be. All right, are there any other --

MR. DURRER: All right, and just a --
THE COURT: -- questions or comments?
MR. DURRER: Yeah, just a housekeeping matter, Your

Honor. With respect to the DIP modification motion, there's still some wordsmithing going on, so what we would propose, just adjourn that to the May 19 hearing. Hopefully, we'll have that all wrapped up.

THE COURT: Very good. All right. Thank you, again.

I appreciate all the work you put into this.
MR. DURRER: Thank you, Your Honor. And we appreciate the work that the parties put in, as well. It was a team effort, and we're grateful for that.

THE COURT: Very good. Anything else for today?
MR. DURRER: No, Your Honor.
THE COURT: All right. When you've cleaned up the order on the procedures, just send us something that's marked to show the changes, and we'll enter it.

MR. DURRER: Thank you, sir.
THE COURT: Thank you. Okay, we're adjourned.
MR. DURRER: Bye-bye.
