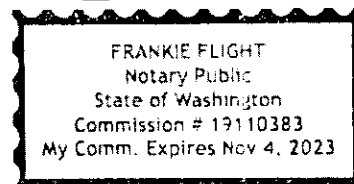

Washington kisses goodbye to 6-game losing streak at Philly

PHILADELPHIA — Montreal Harrell blew kisses to the Philly crowd on a bucket that kept Washington's upset rolling.

Spencer Dinwiddie and Kyle Kuzma did their part to help the Wizards kiss their losing streak goodbye.

Dinwiddie scored the go-ahead bucket with 90 seconds left in the game and had his first career triple-double to lead the Washington Wizards to a 106-103 win over the Philadelphia 76ers on Wednesday night.

Dinwiddie had 14 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists. Kuzma scored 24 points and the Wizards snapped a six-game losing streak.

"The points just came because I shot a lot," Dinwiddie said. "I didn't shoot well."

Kuzma joked Dinwiddie — who was just 4 of 16 — had a quadruple-double thanks to "missed shots."

"The No. 1 way to get out of a funk is just ball out," Kuzma said.

Harrell, who scored 14 points, hit a 16-footer for

102-98 lead and blew kisses with his outstretched right arm and one with his left to a stunned Philly crowd headed into a timeout. The Wizards won with Bradley Beal sidelined at least a week with an injured left wrist.

Joel Embiid had 27 points and 14 rebounds for the 76ers.

• Josh Richardson made six three-pointers and scored 23 points, Jayson Tatum hit two key free throws and finished with 19 points and host Boston held off the Charlotte Hornets 113-107, overcoming a career-best 38 points by LaMelo Ball.

• Jaren Jackson Jr. had 26 points and 10 rebounds, Ja Morant added 23 points and nine assists and visiting Memphis beat New York 120-108.

• Lu Dort scored 30 points, including 14 straight for Oklahoma City in overtime, and rookie Tre Mann added a career-best 29 in a 120-114 victory at Dallas.

Luka Dončić scored 40 points for the Mavericks in the opener of a six-game homestand, their longest of the season.

• Gary Harris scored 22

points and Wendell Carter Jr. had 19 points and 18 rebounds to help visiting Orlando rally past Indiana 119-118.

• Christian Wood and rookie Jalen Green scored 21 points each and Houston beat visiting Cleveland 115-104 to snap an 11-game home skid.

Cleveland rookie Evan Mobley had a career-high 29 points and had 12 rebounds.

• Tyrese Haliburton scored seven of his 12 points in the fourth quarter on his way to a double-double, and host Sacramento handed Brooklyn its sixth consecutive loss, 112-101.

Harrison Barnes scored 19 points and Haliburton had 11 assists to help the Kings stop a seven-game skid.

• Trent Forrest had career highs of 18 points and eight assists to lead Utah to a 108-104 victory over visiting Denver.

• Anthony Davis had 30 points and 15 rebounds and Carmelo Anthony scored 24 to lift the host Lakers past Portland 99-94. Portland's Norman Powell scored 30.

OMAHA, Neb. — Olivia Nelson-Ododa and Christyn Williams scored 17 points apiece, and 10th-ranked UConn shook off a slow start to beat Creighton 76-56 on Wednesday night with an ill coach Geno Auriemma in the locker room the entire game. Auriemma's illness was

not related to COVID-19, according to the SNY network.

The Huskies, who were not sharp in a win over Providence on Sunday, fell behind by double digits early against the Bluejays and didn't take their first lead until the third quarter.

With a healthy Stewart, the Storm were 20-8 and had the best record in the WNBA at 16-5 at the Olympic break with 11 games left.

However, Stewart missed two regular-season games to rest and two more because of the Achilles injury while Seattle posted a 5-6 record down the stretch. The late-season slide and Stewart's postseason absence doomed any chance of a second straight league title for the 2020 WNBA champions.

Stewart began the "unfinished business" talk shortly after the season and expressed a strong desire to return to Seattle, but her future with the Storm came into question when Seattle placed its core designation on Jewell Loyd and left Stewart on the free-agent market.

The 27-year-old Syracuse, N.Y., native who starred with the Connecticut Huskies reportedly had a meeting with New York Liberty owners and coaching staff.

Maybe Stewart will decide to return home next year when she's an unrestricted free agent again.

But for now, the Storm remain a title contender with the three-time WNBA All-Star who averaged 20.3 points, 9.5 rebounds, 2.7 assists, 1.7 blocks and 1.2 steals last season.

"Stewie is the best player in the world, and having her on our team means we will always be in the mix to compete for another championship," coach Noelle Quinn said. "She takes great pride in her preparation, elevates everyone's level of play and most important just wants to win."

Seattle has nine players under contract, not including 12-time WNBA All-Star point guard Sue Bird, who is expected to return.

The Storm has also extended qualifying offers to restricted free agents Jordin Canada and Stephanie Talbot.

Veteran guard January joins Seattle for last year

Before calling it quits on a decorated WNBA career that includes a 2012 league championship and a 2014 All-Star nod, veteran point guard Briann January wanted to return home.

The Spokane native who starred at Lewis and Clark High signed a one-year deal with the Storm Wednesday and plans to retire after her 14th season.

"I'm so excited to have the opportunity to come back to my home state for my final season in the W," January said in a statement released by the team Wednesday. "I've always admired the way the Storm operates both on and off the court. I can't wait to get to work with this talented group of women and do my part in helping this team win another championship."

The 5-foot-8 point guard brings a wealth of experi-

ence to a Storm backcourt that includes three-time WNBA All-Star Loyd, who signed a two-year supermax deal worth \$463,030 on Tuesday.

Last season January averaged 7.0 points, 3.1 assists and 1.8 turnovers while shooting a career best 42.5% on field goals and 38% on three-pointers in 29 games for the Connecticut Sun. She also collected her seventh WNBA All-Defensive team selection.

Adding January makes Storm backup point guards Jordin Canada or Epiphanny Prince expendable.

Canada is a restricted free agent who was extended a qualifying offer from the Storm while Prince has a non-guaranteed contract worth \$115,000.

The Storm has five picks (Nos. 9, 17, 18, 21 and 33) in the 2022 WNBA draft that's set to be held in April.
