Re: Dispute the amount

I write to dispute the proposed disallowance of my claim because in the first instance I paid for over 4 different accounts. During that time when we were paying for those accounts we were advised not to use the same names or addresses or telephone numbers so I opened different accounts in different names using my children, my brother and plus my different names i.e Margaret Mbulaiteye (which was identified by you no. 1355066); Margaret Mbulaiteye-Saimo, Kahwa (no. 1355067), the name Mbulaiteye is my father's name which I use, Maureen Kesaano (n. 1350984) she is my daughter and Sserwadda Msafiri (no. 1369053) he is my brother. I paid for all those accounts and during our filing I filed the claim in time providing the only evidence I had which was the names of the claims which you also had found under telexfree transactions. However, you are now telling me that the TelexFree Trustee reviewed my Claim and proposed to disallow it, citing that I did not respond within 30 days of the notice. I did not respond to that notice because I have had a challenge with internet these past months so that I saw that notice when time had passed so I could not respond. But I find that in Exhibit A-1 only one account Keslovely (no. 1350984) in my daughter's name Maureen Kesaano) is mentioned, no mention of the other accounts which I opened in Margaret Mbulaiteye (no.1355066) or Margaret Mbulaiteye-Saimo, Kahwa (no. 1355067) or Msafiri Sserwadda (no. 1369053) are mentioned and yet there have been identified in the accounts "Telefree schedule F2 creditors Uganda". I paid \$ 1,425 for each of the accounts plus \$ 49.90 VOIP. I sincerely feel it is unfair to disallow my claim not to pay at all just because we were never given receipts for our payments.
