BACKGROUND ON CLAIM

- 1. On or about July 31, 2013, Gwinnett 316 Associates, as Landlord, and Uni-Select USA, Inc., as Tenant, entered into a five (5) year *Lease* ("**Lease**") for approximately 12,330 square feet of warehouse and office space in a building located at 625 Old Norcross Road, Suite D-2, Lawrenceville, Gwinnett County, Georgia ("**Premises**"). Pursuant to the terms of the Lease, the Lease expired on January 31, 2019.
- 2. On or about December 15, 2013, Gwinnett 316 Associates, as Landlord, and Uni-Select USA, Inc., as Tenant, entered into an *Amendment to Lease* ("**First Amended Lease**").
- 3. On February 9, 2015, Uni-Select USA, Inc. entered into an Asset Purchase Agreement with IEH Auto Parts LLC, wherein Uni-Select USA, Inc. agreed to sell substantially of the assets of Uni-Select USA, Inc., including Uni-Select USA, Inc.'s interest in the Lease and the Premises, to IEH Auto Parts LLC.
- 4. On June 15, 2015, Landlord consented to the assignment of the Lease by Uni-Select USA, Inc. to IEH Auto Parts LLC ("**Tenant**").
- 5. On or about July 13, 2018, GW 316 Commerce Center, LLC, as successor-in-interest to Gwinnett 316 Associates, as Landlord, and Tenant entered into a *Second Amendment to Lease* ("**Second Amended Lease**"). Pursuant to the terms of the Second Amended Lease, the Lease expires on January 31, 2024.
- 6. On or about October 10, 2018, GW 316 Commerce Center, LLC assigned, sold, transferred and set over all rights, title and interests of the Lease to 1005 Raco Court Owner, LLC ("Landlord").
- 7. The Lease, First Amended Lease and Second Amended Lease are hereinafter jointly referred to as the "Lease."

BACKGROUND ON CLAIM

- 8. Due to their voluminous nature, and as the Debtors are in possession of the Lease documents, copies are not being attached hereto, but will be sent to any party making a request for same.
- 9. On January 31, 2023 ("Petition Date"), a voluntary Petition was filed by IEH Auto Parts Holding LLC and its related Debtors and Debtors-in-Possession, including Tenant IEH Auto Parts LLC (together, "Debtors") under Chapter 11 of Title 11 of the UNITED STATES CODE "(BANKRUPTCY CODE") with the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Southern District of Texas, Houston Division ("Bankruptcy Court"), which cases have been jointly consolidated for administrative purposes only ("Chapter 11 Cases").
- 10. Pursuant to the terms of the Lease, the rental obligations (which includes the base rent, additional rent, and percentage rent) are subject to a reconciliation at the end of each year. After the reconciliation, there is a balance of \$4,249.96 owed for year 2022 ("CAM Reconciliation"). Attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, and incorporated herein by reference, is a copy of Landlord's invoice which shows the 2022 CAM Reconciliation due and owing to the Landlord. Since this amount is billed post-petition, Landlord asserts this amount is an administrative claim. In addition, Landlord included this amount in its Cure Objection (**Dkt.405**) filed on April 25, 2023.
- 11. Out of an abundance of caution, however, since this amount accrued pre-petition, Landlord is filing this Proof of Claim for the 2022 CAM Reconciliation. To the extent that this amount is paid as part of a cure payment or as an administrative claim, Landlord will withdraw this Proof of Claim.
- 12. Landlord's Claim consists of all actual, incidental and consequential amounts owed as provided under the terms of the Lease.

- 13. Tenant Debtor has continued to occupy and profit from its use of the Premises from Petition Date through the date of filing of this Proof of Claim.
- 14. Landlord reserves and preserves the right to file an administrative expense priority claim for any unpaid post-petition rental obligations of the Lease should Debtor fail to make any monthly Lease payment.
- 15. If the Lease is not assumed and is ultimately rejected, however, Landlord reserves and preserves the right to amend this Proof of Claim to include the rejection damages of the remaining rental obligations of the Lease, as well as to include any additional breach of contract damages for any damages to the Property, and costs incurred relating to Debtor's default including, but not limited to, reletting charges, broker commissions, attorneys' fees, interest, repair and remodeling costs and expenses, as well as any sign removal charges. Nothing herein shall be construed to be a waiver of any claim that Landlord may have as a result of the rejection of the Lease by the Debtor.
- 16. The filing of this Proof of Claim is not a waiver of any of Landlord's rights to file either a rejection claim and/or an administrative expense claim for any unpaid post-petition rental obligation.
- 17. Furthermore, Landlord reserves the right to amend or supplement this Claim at any time and for any reason, including, without limitation: (a) to increase or otherwise adjust the total claim amount or any component thereof as a result of additional information or otherwise: (b) to revise the estimated amounts or substitute actual amounts for estimated amounts; (c) to include any additional breach of contract damages for any damages to the Property, and costs incurred relating to Debtor's default of the Lease, or (d) to revise any of the statements and information contained herein or to add new information and/or documents relating to the Claim asserted hereby.

18. The filing of this Claim is not an election of remedies, and Landlord does not waive, and expressly reserves and preserves any and all rights it may have under the Lease with Debtor and/or any applicable law and/or claims asserted hereby, including against the Debtor or any of the Debtor's affiliates or guarantors of the debt.
