NOTICE OF ORDER GRANTING UNOPPOSED MOTION TO CONTINUE DISCLOSURE STATEMENT HEARING TO SEPTEMBER 16, 2020 AND SETTING OTHER DEADLINES

NOTICE IS GIVEN that, in order to accommodate continued settlement discussions between the Debtors and interested parties regarding the Plan of Liquidation filed in this case, the Court entered an Order Granting the Unopposed Motion to Continue Disclosure Statement Hearing to September 16, 2020 and Setting Other Deadlines [ECF No. 909] (the "Order") on July 20, 2020.

NOTICE IS GIVEN that, pursuant to the Order, a **rescheduled** Hearing will be held on **September 16, 2020 at 2:00 P.M.**, which may be attended telephonically, **Call in Number: (888) 684-8852 Access Code: 1238244**, to consider and possibly approve the proposed disclosure statement dated April 15, 2020, or any amendments thereto. The deadline for the Debtors and Committee of Unsecured Creditors to file any amendments to the disclosure statement or plan is August 25, 2020.

This hearing was previously scheduled for July 29, 2020. Each participant must comply with each telephone hearing requirement listed below. [Note: If you have problems connecting, call the court at (503) 326-1500 or (541) 431-4000.]

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that objections to the proposed disclosure statement must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds and details of objection, and must be filed by **September 8, 2020**. Objections must be filed with the clerk of the court either electronically or at the U.S. Bankruptcy Court, 405 E 8th Avenue #2600, Eugene, Oregon 97401, and be served on Michael W. Fletcher, Tonkon Torp LLP, 888 SW Fifth Avenue, Suite 1600, Portland, OR 97204.

TELEPHONE HEARING REQUIREMENTS

Participants must comply with each requirement listed below:

- a. You must call in and connect to the telephone hearing line or personally appear in the judge's courtroom no later than the hearing time above. The court will not call you.
- b. You may be asked to call again from another phone if your connection is weak or creates static or disruptive noise.
- c. Please mute your phone when you are not speaking. If you do not have a mute function on your phone, press * then 6 to mute and * then 6 again to unmute if you need to speak. Do not put the court on hold if it will result in music or other noise. If available, set the phone to "Do Not Disturb" so it will not ring during the hearing.
- d. When it is time for you to speak, take your phone off the "speaker" option to minimize background noise. Position the telephone to minimize paper rustling. Do not use a keyboard or talk with others in the room. Be aware that telephone hearings may be amplified throughout the courtroom.
- e. Do not announce your presence until the court calls your case. Simply stay on the line until the judge starts the hearings even if there is only silence and continue to listen quietly until your case is called.
- f. Whenever speaking, first identify yourself.
- g. Be on time. The judge may handle late calls the same as a late appearance in the courtroom.
